Music was provided by the Royal Australian Air Force Band, and there was a flypast over the skies provided by an aircraft WW2 Veteran Leading Seaman Harold Ristrom (Hiram) read from the RAAF Museum. The Navy Guards in their whites looked spectacular against the grey day as they marched in unison.



The Shrine Guards paraded up the Forecourt and flags were lowered to half-mast. The Catafalque Party took their positions around the Eternal Flame and the overflowing crowd waited patiently for the Premier of Victoria, The Honourable Daniel Andrews to arrive shortly followed by Lieutenant Governor, the Honourable Marilyn Warren AC.

The Official Party, dignitaries and special guests included Air Vice-Marshal Chris Spence AO (Retd), Chairman of the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees, Life Governors and Governors, the Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Defence Service Chiefs, Consular Corps, Returned & Services League and Legacy, Veterans' Associations, the Premier's Spirit of ANZAC Prize 2015 finalists and the Shrine Young Ambassadors.

A wreath was laid inside the Shrine by the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria on behalf of the people of Victoria. (The Governor General herself was in London). Many wreaths were laid on the steps at the Forecourt by student representatives.

After the bugler played the 'Last Post' there was the One Minute Silence where stillness fell upon everyone as we shared the precious moment to collectively remember those who

No matter what creed or background you come from this is a Service not to be missed. Put it in your diary for next year.









# Wreath Laying Ceremony Tuesday 15th December 11.00am Shrine of Remembrance, Sanctuary



Each year the AMC/LSI Assoc. of Victoria hold a service on 15 December to honour and remember the men and women who served with **HMAS WESTRALIA**, **KANIMBLA**, **MANOORA** and **ASSAULT**. The date chosen marks the first major landing operation by an Australian Landing Ship Infantry (LSI) during WWII. As a unit of the United States 7<sup>th</sup> Fleet at Arawe, New Britain, it was HMAS WESTRALIA which took part in that historic operation on 15th December 1943. According to Executive Officer, W.N. Swan, "It would require the ship's company to put in a superhuman effort to achieve their mission." And that they did. Subsequent to the Arawe landing, HMAS WESTRALIA, KANIMBLA, MANOORA and ASSAULT all took part in several major landing operations culminating in the Allies celebrating VP Day on 15 August 1945.



# VETERANS in BORNEO for the 70th ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATIONS

In June 2015 eight WW2 Australian Veterans were in Borneo for a week of commemorations for the anniversary of the Oboe landing, Australia's last major campaign of WW2. The Oboe campaigns amphibious landing of Australian troops on Borneo beaches, were carried out by the Royal Australian Navy Landing Ships Infantry HMAS Kanimbla, Manoora, Westralia and Assault Beach Commandos to help liberate the people of Borneo from Japanese occupation, May/July 1945.

### Landing Ships Infantry & Commandos Training Base Port Stephens NSW

In June 1942, Commander Frederick Norton Cook DSC former Commander of the Combined Operations Centre, in command of the Landing Craft for the withdrawal of No 12 Commando's Bruneval Raid 15/5/42, and on loan to the RAN to help establish an Australian combined operations school, identified Port Stephens as the ideal location to establish a RAN training base for amphibious landing.

The stone frigate HMAS ASSAULT was commissioned on 1 September 1942. ASSAULT was initially operated from HMAS WESTRALIA, but moved ashore on 10 December 1942. The base's main purpose was to train boat crew for landing craft, commandos to prepare beaches and coordinate landing on the shore, and signals sections to facilitate communications between ships and land-based forces.

The young men became members of the elite Royal Australian Navy Special Service Beach Commando Force. Intensive training was given in driving and landing small craft of armed soldiers onto beaches, hand to hand combat, weaponry of all types, explosives training for underwater demolition techniques and jungle warfare. ASSAULT commandos served in Dutch New Guinea, Borneo and many on islands in the south west Pacific, often behind enemy lines.

Training at ASSAULT was initially hampered by the lack of LCVP and LCM craft available. By March 1943 enough landing craft had been manufactured in Australia and delivered for full-scale landing exercises; RAN Landing Ships Infantry was born (LSI). HMAS WESTRALIA, MANOORA, KANIMBLA and the US Navy ship USS HENRY T ALLEN were involved in landing under simulated invasion conditions on Zenith Beach, Wreck Beach and Box Beach in readiness for the amphibious invasions of Dutch New Guinea, Tarakan, Balikpapan, as well as the Leyte and Lingayen invasions of the Philippines.

The Naval Beach Commandos hold a unique place in Australian naval history. From 1942 to 1945 around 1000 RAN sailors trained in amphibious warfare alongside their compatriots from the Army, Air Force and large numbers of US servicemen. These sailors played an instrumental role in the Operation OBOE landing at Tarakan, Brunei Bay and Balikpapan.

In April 1945, the base was given to the Royal Navy, who used it as a Commando Depot for the Royal Marines units attached to the British Pacific Fleet.

Really we were little more than kids but we grew up fast.






# THIRD GENERATION in the ROYAL AUSTRALIAN NAVY

### SPO Archibald Henry Dick PM1160

Study Tour by Queensland Students

In 2014 a group of 15 students from the Pimlico State School in Queensland, accompanied by teacher, went on a 15 days study tour of South Africa and Swaziland with the view of visiting the grave sites, war memorials and scenes of engagement of Australian service personnel from Boer War to WW 1 & 2.

Well before departure each student was given basic details of an Australian serviceman buried in the Territories to be visited. One student, Miss Melyssa Thacker, was given my father's details; Archibald Henry Dick PM1160 served RAN in WW 1 & 2. As a SPO he served on HMS KANIMBLA, Armed Merchant Cruiser from her commissioning until May/June 1941. He died in hospital in Durban June 12th 1941 and is buried at Stellawood Cemetery in Durban South Africa.

On the 9th July 2014, Melyssa with the other students visited Dad's grave and after a brief Ceremony of Remembrance left tokens of their visit.

It is wonderful that young people are still conscious of service and sacrifice of previous generations. Melyssa recorded in her school's diary of the tour, "I was very honoured to be able to commemorate Archibald's life on behalf of his family."
