The Story of DEMS and her Banner

Dear Chris, unfortunately I am unable to clear my previous commitments for Saturday morning.

Perhaps this note will be an encouragement for your group, and you will be able to prevent Westralia from meeting the fate which nearly destroyed DEMS.

With us, the old boys slowly dwindled away until they were no more, except for one individual.

I used to take the family away for Anzac Day weekends and attend the Anzac Ceremony in Bright - a lovely weekend. One year we stayed home and I thought I would watch the march on telly. I was shocked to see that the DEMS banner was not there. I started asking questions, and found that DEMS had been absorbed onto the Minesweepers because of our few numbers. Then the Minesweepers were absorbed into the Corvettes! It was then that I learned that another DEMS descendent had also been making enquiries and had joined the Corvettes Association. That was Paul Jensen. At first no-one knew anything about the DEMS, our banner and records. Paul's good detective work found that these were last with a Minesweepers member, but he had passed away. When Paul approached the family, he found the banner in a corner of the garage and all the records had been thrown out. Probably the banner would have gone out with the next indestructible rubbish collection, as the family were a Minesweepers connection and DEMS had no meaning for them. Since then Paul and I have made sure the banner is out at Anzac Day and wherever else we can manage, to honour our fathers and their shipmates. This visibility has attracted a few more DEMS descendants, but it is so frustrating that all our records and documented history has completely disappeared.

I can only encourage you to get organized while you still have a few interested descendants, and before your records, banner etc. are lost. If your fathers were like ours, they were forced into the Navy by the tragedy of war, but the comradeship formed over those five or six years stuck with them for the rest of their lives, and being Navy is something of which they were proud. I think our generation has a responsibility to keep the memory of them alive, even though we may struggle to do so. It is not only our generation we must think of, but the ones to come. I feel very encouraged in speaking with other exservicemen that their grandchildren are showing an interest which was largely lacking in their children. As you said, there is a renewed interest in the Boer War and the First World War. We need to preserve this heritage.

So if the DEMS can assist in any way I am sure we will be very happy to assist - all ten of us! Our only remaining original DEMS is ninety-five, but still keen.

P.S. Just in case some of you do not know who DEMS were, it stands for Defensively Equipped Merchant Ships. These were Naval gunners assigned to merchant ships with a variety of weapons, largely gleaned from Naval dumping grounds. They were only ever a small group, I think about 300 from Victoria, less than fifteen hundred throughout Australia. Many of these had the nasty experience of having a ship sunk under them more than once, especially on the Atlantic convoys. We have a Website at navyyic.net which has attracted a few enquiries. This would be available to you also. All the contact information is on the site.

All the best; keep up the good work. I hope to see Westralia and other LSI's on Anzac Day and other occasions for many years to come.


