Owing to the close proximity of our normal meeting date in April to ANZAC Commemorations, we have once more decided to postpone our April meeting.

The *USS John S McCain* visited Melbourne in 2008 for the centenary of the visit of the 'Great White Fleet of the USN' in 1908. I was delighted to be given a very comprehensive tour of the ship by her proud C.O., CMDR , later CAPT. John Banigan USN Ret. and I'm pleased to report that my friend John receives our news letter each month, and that we are in regular contact, both having a very soft spot for this formidable warship.

She had a collision with a merchant ship in the Singapore straight on August 21, 2017 and the Arleigh Burke guided missile destroyer suffered significant damage to her hull resulting in flooding to nearby compartments, including crew berthing, machinery and communications rooms. Sadly ten US Sailors died in the accident. The ship underwent repair and rectification work plus extensive, accelerated upgrades over the last two years, and she departed 'Fleet activities Yokosuka Japan' on October 28 2019 to conduct comprehensive at-sea testing.



A redelivery is set to take place in the US summer of 2020.
