"Warrant Officer Butterworth is the first female appointed to this significant role and only the ninth person to hold this office since its inception in 1993.

"The Warrant Officer of the Navy is the Navy's most senior sailor and the Senior Enlisted Advisor to the Chief of Navy, Vice Admiral Mike Noonan AO, and his Senior Leadership Group.

"This appointment is reflective of Warrant Officer Butterworth's outstanding career achievements to date, and exemplifies the depth and diversity of leadership across the Australian Defence Force."

Warrant Officer Deb Butterworth, OAM, CSM and Bar, was born in Lilydale, Victoria, and for the first ten years of her life she travelled extensively. She then settled into school life in Perth, Western Australia. Warrant Officer (WO) Butterworth enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy as a Stores Naval Sailor in 1989. WO Butterworth has enjoyed serving in various platforms as a Stores Sailor. These include HMA Ships Jervis Bay (I), Success, Sydney, Manoora, Newcastle, and a short time in Parramatta (IV).

In 2003 and 2005, then Chief Petty Officer (CPO) Butterworth deployed in HMAS Newcastle on Operation CATALYST, the Australian assistance to the reconstruction and rehabilitation of Iraq. CPO Butterworth was awarded a Conspicuous Service Medal (CSM) in 2006 in recognition of her service in Newcastle. When a delayed maintenance period compressed the frigate's operational work-up schedule, the Stores team of six was reduced to two through severe personnel shortages, and the stores information system failed. Deb recalled: 'The difficulties encountered in the preparation period at the time seemed overwhelming. My role required me to support a warship logistically on the other side of the world from its base and ensure my stores procurement remained within the defined budget. I believe the success of this deployment was created in the first month, when I had to call upon every piece of emotional intelligence I possessed to pull a new and disparate team into a cohesive unit. I developed a supply chain plan to ensure all items required from Australia were identified at least six weeks in advance, minimising freight costs and optimising customer satisfaction. I consider the time spent training and developing this system one of my memorable achievements'. Her citation noted that 'Despite a compressed operational workup schedule, severe personnel shortages and

More veterans seeking to manage their post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) will benefit with the expansion of the Government's psychiatric assistance dog program. Minister for Veterans and Defence Personnel Darren Chester said following the successful launch of the program in September there had been increased interest from the ex-service community and organisations passionate about supporting veterans' mental health.

An 80-member-strong delegation of HMAS Canberra's ship's company were among the guests at the Australian War Memorial's Last Post ceremony on Friday 22 November.

The pre-deployment preparations and training for the Australian lead Combined Task Force (CTF) 150 mission wrapped up at HMAS Watson recently, with the task group getting a stamp of approval from the Commodore Flotillas Force Generation Directorate.

Following her deployment in Newcastle, Deb Butterworth CSM joined Albatross. While the air base's logistics requirements are huge and demanding, much of its aircraft strength is deployed in ships' flights, creating a complex network of supply support. Deb applied her extensive Defence Logistics Information system knowledge to the management of aviation stores embarked in ships, which substantially improved the availability of their aircraft.

Promoted Warrant Officer in 2007, she joined Joint Logistics Unit-West as Logistics Services manager, where her organisation ensured that Fleet units deploying were exceptionally well prepared for operations and received enhanced support while alongside. Deb's trial posting of Naval Stores sailors to submarines to raise accountability and support to major fleet unit levels is now standard practice. Her next posting in 2009 was one she had always wanted – Fleet Warrant Officer Naval Stores in the Fleet Training Group, responsible for training and mentoring ships' Supply departments to improve professional standards and practices. To reduce the workload on logistics staff at sea, she introduced direct supply to ships by vendors, replacing receipt via a supply depot, with full compliance with defence audit requirements, and in 2012 her endeavours were recognised with an OAM for meritorious service to RAN logistics management. The citation noted that Deb had 'relentlessly pursued enhanced logistics support to the RAN. Her exceptional knowledge of ADF logistics systems and her commitment to excellence are testament to her professionalism and dedication. Warrant Officer Butterworth's service epitomises the Navy's core values and signature behaviours, and is in the finest traditions of the RAN and the ADF'.

WO Butterworth assumed the role as the Ship's Warrant Officer in HMAS Success in December 2011, Success was integral Operation SOUTHERN INDIAN OCEAN, an activity to support the Australian Maritime and Safety Authority to search for Malaysian Airlines flight MH370 in April 2014. In 2014 WO Butterworth deployed to the Middle East and upon return to Australia WO Butterworth was recognised with a bar to her CSM in recognition of her service in Success.

Australian War Memorial Development Project have been unveiled, outlining how the contemporary story of service and sacrifice will be told to future generations.

A Chinese aircraft carrier fleet passed near Taiwan on Sunday, prompting the self-governing island to scramble ships and jets to monitor the situation. Taiwan's defense ministry said the southbound Chinese fleet passed into the Taiwan Strait but stayed on China's side of the waterway that separates the island from China.

HMS Prince of Wales has sailed into her homeport of Portsmouth for the first time today – marking a significant milestone in the Royal Navy's aircraft carrier history.

The Royal Australian Navy is getting back in the fight for first place in the Sydney to Hobart yacht race for the first time since 2001.

The Independence-variant littoral combat ship USS Montgomery (LCS 8), Royal Australian Navy Anzac-class frigate HMAS Stuart (FFH 153) and fleet replenishment vessel HMAS Sirius (O 266) conducted operations together in the South China Sea, Nov. 6-12.

Australian Defence Force (ADF) members leaving full-time service will be better supported during transition and into new employment under a new contract Defence has signed with Right Management Consultants Pty Ltd.

The Royal Australian Navy's laser airborne depth sounder flight (LADS) has completed its final sortie after 26 years of outstanding service.

The Royal Australian Navy (RAN) replenishment ship HMAS Sirius has arrived in Cam Ranh Bay, Vietnam, as part of Navy's second East Asia Deployment for 2019.

Defence Science and Technology scientists believe that the key to securing Australia's maritime supremacy is understanding the ocean, which is at the core of DST's support to the Royal
