After successfully disembarking the evacuated passengers at Western Port, the crew of the Royal Australian Navy amphibious ship conducted a quick turnaround to return to Mallacoota.

The ship arrived at Western Port at 4:30pm on Saturday and, once the guests were safely disembarked, attention turned to the job of reconstituting and on-loading supplies and equipment to deliver to Mallacoota for the recovery efforts.

A candid photograph posted on Chinese social media sheds light on a Chinese project to develop an unmanned ship similar to the U.S. Navy's Sea Hunter.

The global coronavirus pandemic has increased the use of virtual technology and resulted in the adoption of new and inventive ways of doing things, including the recognition of important career achievements.

The Royal Australian Navy and the Indian Navy demonstrated their interoperability during a recent passage exercise in the Northeast Indian Ocean.

As part of the \$500mil HMAS Cerberus Base Redevelopment Project, Building 188 or 'B' Block was completely refurbished. It has maintained its heritage facade on the eastern side whilst having a new contemporary facade on the western side of the building.

A Next Generation Navy (NGN) initiative to appropriately recognise the service and sacrifice of all Navy personnel and void by volunteering with an ex-veterans organisation, Disaster Relief Australia (DRA) formerly known as Team Rubicon Australia. DRA is a not-for-profit organisation that gives members of the veteran community their sense-of-purpose back. As the name suggests, DRA provides relief assistance to our communities in their time of need when a natural disaster has occurred. DRA uses the collective skillsets of veterans to provide assistance to communities in the event of disasters such as bushfires, floods, tsunamis, and in more recent times, the COVID-19 Pandemic.

As a CASA licenced Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV aka drone)



pilot, my role with DRA is to conduct aerial damage assessments for property owners who have possibly lost their homes, machinery, fence lines and in some cases animals as well. The aerial imagery obtained as part of the assessment is then produced into useable data that the property owner can use when seeking their insurance claims / Government grants, after all a

picture tells a story. As a member of the DRA Aerial Damage Assessment Team (ADAT), I have volunteered and deployed to assist with post bushfire recovery operations in Western New South Wales in December 2019 and again in the beautiful Buchan Valley in East Gippsland in February this year.

In addition to DRA conducting operations in disaster areas, DRA also conducts what are known as Service Projects, these may range from cleaning up Veterans Meeting Rooms, to our chainsaw teams clearing a farmers property for them or partnering up with other organisations to provide assistance. Once such Service Project I became involved with was when the Aerial Damage Assessment Team deployed on Service Project Karriwara, assisting archaeologists from the University of Queensland and the Mithaka Aboriginal Corporation in mapping and surveying ancient cultural sites across over 4,000 hectares of the Channel Country in south west Queensland.

Republic of Korea and the United States for Exercise Pacific Vanguard, in waters off Guam.

World leading, Australian designed antimissile technology has been installed on HMAS Adelaide by BAE Systems Australia in a 'COVID-collaboration' with the Royal Australian Navy.

The Morrison Government's National Shipbuilding Program has reached another milestone with the keel laying for the first Offshore Patrol Vessel (OPV) under construction in WA.

The RAN has officially welcomed Rear Admiral Chris Smith to the role of Deputy Chief of Navy and Head Navy People Training and Resources (HNPTAR).

The world knows the Republic of Kiribati as a very low-lying nation in the mid-Pacific that is in danger of inundation as the climate changes and sea levels rise. Much less is known about its strategic location and the attention now being paid to it by Beijing.

HMA Ships Stuart and Arunta sailed in company with ships from Japan, South Korea and the United States in the Pacific Ocean this week.

With global tensions rising and the war of words between Beijing and Washington escalating, the rising power has sought to flex its growing military capabilities, conducting joint carrier operations for the first time in a direct challenge to the US Navy.

Current and former members of the Royal Australian Navy and the United States Navy gathered in Albany, Western Australia, on August 28 to remember submariners who died during World War II.

The Morrison Government will build a Maritime Security Training Centre in Darwin to facilitate training of Royal Australian Navy and other Australian Defence Force members for Maritime Security operations.

September Hero

Our September hero is LWRWTR Edith Jessie Flanders WR/1528 – Code-Breaker



Edith Jessie Flanders was born on the 10 March 1921 and grew up on her father's property 7 miles out of Harrow, Victoria. Her mother did not have a licence and as she could not travel to school, she was educated by Governesses until she went to boarding school at age 14.

As dawn broke over Melbourne's Shrine of Remembrance on Anzac Day 2018, war veterans gathered

along St Kilda Road readying themselves for the annual march, their enthusiastic camaraderie warming the crisp, solemn autumn air. Among these revered men and women who served our nation with valour was Jessie Flanders, who at 97 was marching in the Melbourne service for the very first time.

On Jessie's lapel, almost outshining her proud smile, was a precious gold pin she'd received from former UK Prime Minister David Cameron. The veteran Women's Royal Australian Navy officer was taken by surprise when the little package, postmarked from England, arrived at the post office of her home town Casterton, in far western Victoria, seven years earlier. First-aid personnel are enhancing Victoria's public testing as part of Operation COVID-19 Assist.

The Royal Australian Navy's lead ship of the Supply Class auxiliary oiler replenishment (AOR) ships, NUSHIP Supply, has set sail from Navantia's Ferrol shipyard for Australia.

HMAS Canberra returned to Sydney after a three-month deployment comprised of multilateral training exercises as part of a task group, maritime integration with Army elements and a successful search and rescue in the Pacific.

BAE Systems Australia has welcomed a fifth ANZAC class warship to its Henderson facility as part of the fleet upgrade that will keep the ships in service until they are replaced by the Hunter class frigates.
