Welcome to the Navy Victoria Network newsletter for August 2012.

Another month has passed and numerous activities (apart from AFL) have occurred in Victoria. Being the middle of winter why not try and browse the internet for interesting items to keep the "salt in the veins". One website that may be of interest is the "Historic Naval Ships Association" www.hnsa.org which lists worldwide locations and photograph's of approximately 175 historic naval ships, and provides some excellent links as well. The website was established to support the preservation of historic naval vessels, and to honour those who served at sea in defence of the nation. The preserved naval vessels in Australia are all individually listed.

Whilst travelling along the coast and in Victoria why not visit some of the excellent local maritime museums that all have similar aims of the HNSA website to preserve maritime history. These museums are generally staffed by enthusiast volunteers, and provide the maritime history for the area of their location. The main museums in Victoria are at Port Albert, Port Welshpool, Cerberus, Queenscliff, Williamstown (Castlemaine), Geelong, Warrnambool, Melbourne Maritime Museum (Polly Woodside), Portland and Port Fairy. Further inland on the Murray River the museums at the Port of Echuca and Swan Hill are well worth a visit with operating steam machinery, paddle

The NUSHIP Canberra was loaded onto the heavy lift ship MV Blue Marlin in Spain at the Navantia Shipyard, and is quite an impressive site for those that have seen the photographic images. The MV Blue Marlin is en route and due to arrive in Melbourne around the 29th September. The Blue Marlin will berth at Station Pier for a number of days to complete unloading preparations before being unloaded in a deep water area in Port Phillip Bay off Frankston.
