<u>Editorial</u>

Welcome to the Navy Victoria Network newsletter for July 2011.

Happy 100th birthday Navy! Kicking off a wide range of celebrations around Australia this year to commemorate 100 years of faithful service since the Australian Navy received the "Royal" prefix on 10 July 1911, the new Chief of Navy, VADM Ray Griggs opened the "Pride of the Nation" exhibition at Melbourne's Shrine of Remembrance on 8 July. Those readers of the NVN who were aware of this important event (and who braved an icy cold day to attend the opening ceremony) were all very impressed with Admiral Grigg's address. It focused on the well-deserved pride that all current serving and retired members of the RAN should feel this year as we celebrate the great traditions, gallant wartime service, the enviable combat capability and the professionalism and sacrifice of many thousands of Australians who served in the RAN over the past 100 years.

Acknowledging the important role that Victoria played in the establishment of the Commonwealth Naval Forces in 1901 (the predecessor to the RAN), Admiral Griggs reminded the audience that "We cannot create the future force without understanding and valuing our past. It is where we have come from, and the values and courage of those who have gone before should inspire us to succeed into the future." Providing a visual reminder of some of the events and people that earned our Navy the "pride of the nation" is a magnificent exhibition (drawn largely from the Naval Historical Collection in Sydney and from the HMAS CERBERUS Museum) at the Shrine of Remembrance. All readers of the NavyVIC website are strongly encouraged to take the time to visit the Shrine and browse through the
