

THE YEAR AHEAD

All members of the Naval Family should be aware that plans are in hand to mark the centenary of two particularly significant milestones in the history of the Royal Australian Navy in 2013 – the commencement of officer training at Osborne House, Geelong, on 11 February 1913 and the establishment of the Australian Fleet on arrival of the first HMAS Australia in Sydney on 4 October of the same year.

Statement from General David Hurley, Chief of the Defence Force Today the Minister for Defence has announced details of the Governments response to the DLA Piper Review of Allegations of Sexual and other Forms of Abuse in Defence. <u>More....</u> designated Australian Capital Territory and why it was chosen as the site for the Royal Australian Naval College. (Duntroon, the Army equivalent, had already been established on ACT in Canberra). The RANC buildings at HMAS Creswell were under construction at the time the 22 selected 13-year-olds were due to start their training in February 1913. That first entry included names which were to become famous in WW2 – Collins, Farncomb, Showers, Getting, Burnett – men who had a huge impact on the development and reputation of the RAN through the 20th century.

At the time of Federation in January 1901 the Naval assets of the individual States were brought together as the Commonwealth Naval Forces. They were a motley collection including the monitor HMAS Cerberus, torpedo boats, gun boats and smaller craft, all in somewhat dilapidated condition. There was initially little support for the development of a force which could assume responsibility for the nation's maritime defence but after 1905, when Captain Creswell was appointed Director of Naval Forces, things changed. A persistent, determined and far-sighted man, Creswell had been invalided out of the Royal Navy before coming to Australia in the 1880's. From the time of his appointment in 1905 he relentlessly pursued his vision of creating a Navy for the fledgling Commonwealth and making the nation responsible for its own maritime defence rather than relying on Great Britain. Backed by some supportive politicians, most notably the visionary Prime Ministers Deakin and Fisher, and with the enormously influential help of the famous First Sea Lord, Jackie Fisher, he won approval for the construction (in Britain) of an Australian Fleet based on a battle cruiser HMAS Australia supported by light cruisers, destroyers and submarines.

King George V gave approval to the use of the prefix 'Royal' by the Australian and Canadian Navies in July 1911 and the Australian Commonwealth Naval Board was officially created shortly thereafter. On 4 October 1913 the recently commissioned HMAS Australia led a 'long grey line' including HMA Ships Sydney, Melbourne and Encounter(light cruisers), Warrego, Yarra and Parramatta (destroyers) into Sydney Harbour where the last C-in-C of the British Australian Squadron hauled down his flag and His Majesty's Australian Fleet was born.


